The matters to be heard by the Juvenile Hearing Officer are limited to cases in which a child under the age of eighteen years on the date of the alleged offense is charged with violating any provision of Title 28 of Arizona Revised Statutes not declared to be a felony, and violations of any city, town or political subdivision ordinance not pertaining to curfew violations. The Juvenile Hearing Officer will not hear the offense of Driving Under the Influence. This appointment is effective this date and until further order of the court or rescission or operation of law:




IN RE: ASSIGNMENT OF ELECTIONS CASES

IN RE: POLICIES AND PROCEDURES TO PROMOTE COJET COMPLIANCE

Pursuant to the Arizona Code of Judicial Administration and the Code of Conduct for Judicial Employees, each employee must complete continuing education each calendar year to include a course in ethics, network security and in other areas as designated by the Supreme Court. Currently, the requirement is 16 hours which may change from year to year. An employee who has fulfilled this requirement is said to be COJET (Committee on Judicial Education and Training) compliant. The court provides numerous training opportunities throughout the year to ensure that all employees are able to meet this requirement. It is each employee's responsibility to register for training and keep track of their accrued hours. In addition, COJET certificates or other acceptable course attendance documentation must be forwarded to the Training Coordinator within 30 days of coursework/training completion.


Given both the importance of maintaining a high functioning workforce and of complying with the Arizona Supreme Court training mandate, the court will consider failure to comply with the requirement to be a cause for discipline.

In addition to the COJET mandated hours and subject matter, departments may mandate additional hours and/or subject matter to be completed during the year. These hours may count towards COJET. Non-compliance with the specific direction of the department in regards to training that is beyond the minimum COJET requirement may cause an employee to be subject to disciplinary action.

THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

The department director or designee shall impose discipline if an employee fails to comply with the training requirement, unless an employee has been granted an exemption as authorized by the Arizona Code of Judicial Administration. As part of this discipline, any areas of deficiency shall also be remedied by the employee. Any hours needed to make up for the deficiency shall not count towards the COJET hours of any other year. In addition to the requirements specified by the Arizona Supreme Court, this court has decided to issue further guidance to assist employees with compliance. All employees must complete their annual training hours by November 15th each year. Employees who are non-compliant at that time will have a grace period until December 31st to remedy this deficiency.


Is hereby reappointed as Juvenile Court Commissioner and is dually appointed as a Superior Court Judge Pro Tempore under the following conditions:
