



Primary Election Tuesday, August 26, 2014

EARLY BALLOTS

Any voter may vote by early ballot. Voters may begin requesting an early ballot as early as 93 days before the election. Early ballot requests must be received by the Recorder's office prior to the second Friday before the election. Early voters may vote in person at the Recorder's office, 1415 Melody Lane, Bldg B, Bisbee, AZ.

PERMANENT EARLY VOTING LIST (PEVL)

Voters may request to be placed on the permanent early voting list to receive an early ballot by mail for any election for which they are eligible. To be placed on the permanent early voting list the voter must provide their request in writing.

Ninety (90) days prior to a primary election the Recorder's office will send a notice to all voters who are on the permanent early voting list. This notice will advise the voter the dates of the upcoming election, when they can expect the early ballot to be mailed and a place to mark if they wish to be removed from the permanent early voting list. The notice will also include the address of where the early ballot will be mailed, the voter's party affiliation, a place for the voter to select a party ballot for open primary elections if they are registered as Independent, Party Not Designated or Other. This selection will not change their party affiliation on their voter registration as it will only be used to send them a party ballot for the upcoming open primary.

PROCESSING EARLY BALLOTS

In order for the voter's ballot to be counted you MUST sign the affidavit envelope so that your signature can be verified by the Recorder's office. If the early ballot is received prior to Election Day the results will appear on Election Night. Early ballots received on Election Day will be processed and tabulated 2-3 days after Election Day. All ballots are counted and results included in the final official results.
