We can't accept pets of any kind. We have limited space therefore they can't bring lots of stuff with them. Dinner is served at 6PM daily. They must vacate the shelter by 7:30 am daily.

Intake Process: GNA staff needs to talk the person directly. They can call or stop in during office hours. We must do a telephone assessment because we need to get and give information to the potential guest.

It provides short term emergency housing and other services for men and families with children under the age of 18. The shelter contains a dormitory for single men and individual rooms for families. To ensure a safe and healthy environment for the residents of Cochise County, the Environmental Health Division (EHD) provides many services to the general public and the regulated community. These services are summarized in the following programs. Visit the program's webpage for more detailed information and fee schedule:

- **Food Safety** – EHD provides education and routine inspections of a variety of food facilities in the County. Reports of food borne illness are promptly investigated.
- **Recreational Health** - To ensure the safety of public and semi-public swimming pools EHD provides education and routine sanitary inspections of these facilities.
- **Public Accommodations** - EHD ensures proper sanitation of hotels/motels/B&Bs and trailer/RV parks by conducting routine inspections.
- **Vector Control** - Provides surveillance and public education of insects and animals that could pose public health threats.
- **Complaints** - EHD investigates citizen complaints and nuisance situations to ensure a safe and healthy environment for all residents.
- **Smoke Free Arizona** - In conjunction with AZDHS, EHD provides complaint investigation services of Proposition 201.

WIC (Women, Infants & Children Supplemental Nutrition Program)

WIC is a special supplemental nutrition program for pregnant and postpartum, infants and children up to age 5. Services include a complete nutritional assessment to determine health risks, individualized food packages, nutrition education and counseling, and referrals to other pertinent programs.

Our healthy food packages provide foods such as:

- Fresh fruits & vegetables
- Whole wheat bread/brown rice/soft corn tortillas
- Whole grain cereals
- Milk/soy and goat milk/lactose-reduced milk
- Cheese/tofu

Maternal & Child Health Home Visiting

- Developmental screening and assessment known as "Ages and Stages" completed on infants and children to determine the need for further evaluation of special needs that the child may have.
- Depression assessment to determine if client may need further assistance beyond dealing with the "baby blues."
- Fetal Alcohol Syndrome assessment on each new client to determine if further evaluation or support is needed.
- Home safety assessments to determine the security needs for the home of a newborn/child.
- Lay counseling on a variety of maternal child health issues and needs and referrals to other programs as needed.

The Family Advocacy Program is designed to preserve Family wellness through prevention. Prevention is accomplished through awareness, education and support. These goals are achieved through distribution of written material, support groups and classes. Unit presentations may be arranged to meet group specific requirements.

- Domestic Violence Program / Child Abuse Prevention
- Sexual Assault Prevention / Family Violence Prevention
- Victim Advocacy & Transitional Compensation

- **New Parent Support Program (NPSP)**

This voluntary program provides educational and supportive services and in-home services to military families with children up to three years old, including Families who are expecting a baby. Focusing on Family support, NPSP attempts to increase Family well-being through community education and the promotion of healthy Family functioning.

- **Survivor Outreach Services (SOS)**

SOS is a multi-agency approach to delivering services to survivors. SOS will allow the Army to better identify the needs of others touched by the loss of a Soldier. The SOS Mission is to expand and improve services to Survivors.

- **Information, Referral and Follow Up (IR&F)**

IR&F provides ready access to information that will assist Service Members and their Families in meeting needs and improving quality of life. It also establishes and maintains cooperative relationships with private, public, military and volunteer information and referral agencies.

- **Financial Readiness Program**

The Financial Readiness Program educates Service Members, Family members, and the Fort Huachuca community about their consumer rights. Financial assistance is given in spending plans, budgeting, debt liquidation, credit concerns, security clearance concerns, Family Supplemental Subsistence Allowance, Service Members Civil Relief Act, etc. Unit training is available, as well as one-on-one appointments.

- **Mobilization and Deployment**

The Mobilization Deployment Specialist will support the Deployment and Mobilization mission by assisting the command, Service Members and their Families throughout the deployment cycle. Unit training as well as one-on-one assistance is available. Areas of assistance include, but are not limited to: Rear Detachment Training, pre-deployment, post deployment, reunion workshops, Family Care Plan Assistance, Operation R.E.A.D.Y. training, Family Readiness Group training and assistance, and Family “survival” strategies throughout the deployment cycle.

- **Relocation Readiness Program (RAP)**

RAP will assist in easing the burden of moving. Assistance offered; official installation packets, welcome packets, Lending Closet, overseas briefings, sponsorship training, and various resources.

- **Outreach Coordinator**

The Outreach Coordinator serves as a link between the military community and ACS, providing a visible subject-matter expert on Family support issues and services. The OC is responsible for effective synchronization and enhancement of program milestones to promote strategies, training and formulation of networks to work with the community.
